Ngā Kōhatu Touchstones

What are Touch stones? Touch stones can ground us and connect us, they are precious; they were used in European culture to help judge a true measure.

The new Religious Education Curriculum (To Tatau Whakapono) uses touchstones at each curriculum level. Touchstones are to emphasise an aspect of your child's journey through school life. Each touchstone has a nuance of distinction from other year levels and a sense of progression. In the course of up to 13 years of education in Catholic schools young people will spend time with each touchstone on this Gospel-based journey.



Years 1 and 2 Whakatau Welcomed


