FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Kia ora whānau! Ngā mihi nunui ki a koutou!

I am feeling very grateful as we come to the end of Week 2 in the last term of the 2024 school year. I am grateful for our wonderful staff and their dedication to our tamariki. Our teaching staff and support staff are working very hard to provide rich learning activities both inside and outside the classroom which our students will love getting involved in. Lots of our staff are pouring energy into camps at the moment - the Year 3 camp was held earlier this week, the Years 7 and 8 Wellington camp is in Week 5 and the Years 5 and 6 Dunedin camp is in Week 6, and all of the various camp programmes look amazing!

I'm grateful too for the wonderful contributions our whānau make to our community here at Hato Hōhepa. We had 5 fantastic parents who supported our staff and students at our Year 3 camp this week (in fact, across all 3 camps, we've had more offers of help than we can take), and we've got a group of whānau who are currently supporting our kura by reviewing some draft material around proposed changes to our school values.

I'm grateful for our new whānau whom we celebrated this week and I'm grateful for the warmth we showed them in our Welcome Mass on Monday.

I'm grateful too for the teaching staff who are working so hard to keep pace with the changes coming out from the Minister of Education and the Ministry of Education. It is amazing (or outrageous) to think that when the 2007 New Zealand Curriculum was introduced, schools had 3 years to prepare for its implementation, and yet here we are in October 2024 and we're being asked to implement 2 areas of a refreshed New Zealand Curriculum in Term 1 2025 and we don't yet have the final versions of those 2 learning areas we're supposed to be implementing!

I'm grateful for the opportunity to work with teaching staff today on our latest Ministry of Education Teacher Only Day to explore the draft curriculum content that is currently available for the implementation of the English curriculum for Years 0-6.

I'm grateful for the energy that staff are giving to planning for 2025.

I'm grateful for the generosity of some of our school families who contribute a little extra to support others in our community who find it challenging to manage the financial demands of family life. I'm grateful for the long Labour weekend and a chance to remember that there's life outside of school too!

With only 37 school days left now in 2024 we are racing towards the end of the year. Please make sure you're staying well informed. Reach out to your child's classroom teacher if you have any questions about what's coming up. Ask your children what's coming up and help them to stay informed too. Please also remind your children that whilst there is lots of exciting things to look forward to and to prepare for, we can still be fully present and we can still meet the high expectations we set for ourselves - everyone doing their best and doing their bit as our Dominican charism tells us, walking in Truth and with respect. Even in its busiest times, our school is a place of learning, and we are all striving towards improved outcomes and towards our full potential.


