We welcome 2 new staff to our teaching team next year - Miss Shanni Robinson will join our senior team teaching in Kārearea class, and Mr Tom Morgan will join our junior team for Term 1 and Term 2, teaching in Ruru class. Mrs Emma Sullivan has been granted parental leave for Terms 1 and 2 2025 - Emma, Chris and Corbin are expecting to grow their family very soon with a new baby due to arrive in December. A very warm welcome to Shanni and Tom, and our very best wishes to Emma and Chris and Corbin! Closer to the end of the year I will ask Shanni and Tom to write a brief introduction which I can share with you all - Shanni currently lives here in Queenstown and Tom is moving down from Auckland before the beginning of the 2025 school year.

Miss Elli MacColl has been on leave this year teaching in Australia. Unfortunately for us, Elli has resigned from her permanent position and will not be returning in 2025. She's planning to do some more traveling and we wish Elli all the very best. Mrs Ros Gale joined us this year in a fixed term position as classroom teacher for Takahē class for 2024. Ros is looking forward to spending more time grandparenting next year and will work with us in a part-time capacity providing release throughout the school in 2025. Rachel Bushell joined our learning support team late last year and was employed fixed term until the end of the 2024 school year. We will miss Rachel next year and have loved her very positive contribution to our community. We wish her all the very best.

We will start 2025 with 7 classrooms, an increase from our current 6 classrooms. To accommodate the extra classroom there will be some movement of classes. We will advise those changes in due course, but in the meantime please be aware that some classes may operate from different locations in 2025 to their current locations.

We will have 2 transition visits later in the term where the children will spend 30 minutes in their 2025 class with their 2025 teacher (where possible). Shortly before the first transition visit, teachers will tell students which class they will be in for 2025. Please note that in some cases, given the size of our school and of particular cohorts, class placement is not a simple matter of course. Where there is an opportunity to choose which class a student is placed in, teachers and leaders work together to make the best choice to give students the best opportunity to flourish, taking into account a wide range of factors including learning and social needs. Be assured that our children are at the heart of our thinking and our decision making. Our teachers do a wonderful job of meeting the needs of our children, identifying where they are at and teaching to their next steps (holistically). If you would like to discuss your child's learning (and other) needs, please make arrangements to meet with the classroom teacher or Team Leader (Lisa or Alice).

WE ARE A WATER-ONLY SCHOOL

Since 2016 the Ministry of Education and the Ministry of Health have encouraged school communities to be "Water-Only Schools". This initiative is supported by Te Whatu Ora and Public Health South, along with other partners. Being a water-only school means that our students are only allowed to drink plain tap water and plain, fat reduced milk at school. Whilst this has been our commitment for some time now at our school, we haven't put a lot of energy into communicating or upholding this expectation. We'd like to improve our work in this area now and value your support. Here's 3 of the most important reasons why we believe this is an important focus:

- 1. New Zealand tap water is safe to drink straight from the tap, plus it's FREE
- 2. Unlike sugary drinks, water doesn't cause tooth decay, obesity, or diabetes
- 3. When we're thirsty, water is perfect (very effective for hydration)

Please help us in the following ways in particular:

- 1. Give your child a drink bottle they can take to school
- 2. Encourage your child to fill the drink bottle with plain tap water at home and at school
- 3. At home, keep sugary drinks for extra special occasions only.

Please do not send your child to school with acidic and sugary drinks, especially sport or energy drinks (including Powerade), fizzy drinks, juice, and 'breakfast' drinks (such as 'Up&Go'). We'll be looking to increase the focus in 2025 on healthy habits in eating and drinking in our school. We look forward to your support on this journey for the wellbeing of our children.
